FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT

Since 2015 South Korea has invested in Louisiana with 2 projects representing a total capital investment of \$3.05 billion. During the period, over 460 jobs were created. Louisiana companies have also established a presence in South Korea including 3 direct investments in the South Korea.

CASE STUDY

In April 2017, Lotte Chemical USA announced the company will establish its headquarters in Lake Charles, where the corporate office will join Lotte Chemical USA's \$1.1 billion monoethylene glycol (MEG) plant. The company is investing in a \$1.9 billion joint venture with Westlake Chemical to build an ethane cracker complex, also under construction on the 250-acre site that will be home to the MEG plant and future headquarters. Combined, the joint venture, MEG plant and headquarters represent more than \$3 billion in capital investment, 265 new direct jobs, and more than 2,300 new indirect jobs.

To secure the combined investments by Lotte Chemical, the State of Louisiana offered the company a competitive incentive package that includes a \$12.5 million performance-based grant to offset wetlands remediation and related infrastructure costs. Additionally, Lotte Chemical will receive the comprehensive solutions of LED FastStart, the nation's No. 1 state workforce training program, along with an Economic Development Award Program performance-based loan of \$1.47 million for site infrastructure improvements, and participation in Louisiana's Quality Jobs and Industrial Tax Exemption programs.
