

Due to declining revenues caused by the COVID-19 Pandemic...

- Nine states have delayed or cancelled transportation project valued at nearly \$4 billion (Hawaii, Kentucky, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Vermont and Washington)
- Eight local governments are taking similar actions, bringing the total closer to \$5 billion
- At least 14 states and one transportation authority also have publicly projected declining revenues totaling a loss of \$2.64 billion
- Five states have vetoed, canceled, or postponed legislative initiatives or ballot measures related to \$734 million in potential transportation funding
