Assessing Your Community for the New Year

Internal assessments are performed by or for community members themselves. Internal assessments may be performed by an economic development agency, chamber, or other individuals or organizations within the community. They may be led by members of the community, a resource available to them (i.e., a university or community college), or a consultant.

The objective of an internal assessment is to identify the community's strengths,

weaknesses, opportunities and threats. This so-called SWOT analysis will serve as the basis for a community-wide dialogue, making citizens aware of current conditions, creating momentum for change, focusing planning efforts for the best use of resources and providing benchmarks for measuring progress.

Assessments are valuable tools in the comprehensive community development process. They create consensus about a community's assets and liabilities; build momentum for change; serve as baselines of performance levels against which to measure progress; and focus resources in a way that ensures positive, visible changes can be made as quickly as possible.
