Yes. Thank you, Chairman Windham, for
the opportunity to make a restatement this morning, and
we have sort of a special day as the not all of the
ITEP applications that are here, but a number of them
that are here today are the first class moving through
under the new rules. And in observing the process of
all of the changes that have been made to the program,
or the more significant changes that were made to the
program over the last 18 months, we want to communicate
to you that we continue to seek input on ways that we
can improve the program, whether it's a great company or
a company that is ISO 9000 qualified. The pathway to
process improvement is through the total quality
management methodology.

We are constantly listening to your customer base, your supplier base and those that have engagement in the process to learn how we can do things better, more efficiently, more effectively without surrendering the elements of process that we have integrated into the program.

So we want ITEP to remain a strong foundation, a focus on retention and creation of new jobs. We want to ensure that ITEP has a positive impact on local revenues and keeping the Louisiana business climate competitive, so we seek to manage those three



primary interests going forward.

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So with that, I would, again, just underscore that we're not through with the process. have heard from different constituencies the challenges that they're facing associated with this, and behind the scenes -- behind the scenes, not in a non-transparent way, we're going to reach out. We're reaching out today for your comments. I'd like to see them in writing, but we'll also reach out to stakeholders, to LIDEA and to others that are going to give us comments and suggestions and constructive pathways, again, so that we can maintain those critical elements of job creation, local voice and the ability to retain a competitive position as we seek to recruit or expand industry in our state in competition with other economic development organizations all over America and, indeed, all over the world.

One other comment is around what is in Rule 503, which is a Statement of Return on Investment, and that will continue to be an important part of Exhibit A. It is a requirement that we're able to show that the public's investment in any project is protected and is one that anticipates a return to the public for private sector investment.

In that, please know that it is a



complex equation. There are so many different factors that influence this, whether it's the number of jobs, the wages that are paid for those jobs, the term, how long is the expectation that this company will be here and be able to meet its obligations.

On the public side, certainly there's the direct and indirect and induced jobs that are impacted by the presence of the company and in the community, what their capital expenditure is, what their direct payroll tax revenues generate, again, the indirect jobs and the property tax that's generated, sales taxes generated. All of those things will be taken into consideration as we do this ROI, but please know that in saying this, from a strategic perspective, yes, there's positive ROI, and we'll be sure to illuminate that, and certainly as it's regarding ITEP.

These are manufacturing jobs. These are jobs that have a big impact outside of the fence line, and that's always a part of our consideration as well. So we know that as we go forward, the ROI and being able to demonstrate that ROI is an important part of what we're about.

So, again, as we move through what has been a period of change, what I can tell you is that a change is one of those constants. We want to keep



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1	getting better, and this program is no exception. We
2	look at all of our programs, but we've heard loud and
3	clear we've got some work to do, and I want you to know
4	that we're going to take that work on.

I got that. I'm just trying to find out what's included in the upgrade. The reason I'm asking the question, I noticed on several of these, it just simply said "upgrade," and on others, they were more specific about what they were doing and what was included.

MR. ZATARAIN:

Yes, sir.

MR. ADLEY:

Some of the things that were included were questionable. So those that come up that just simply say "upgrade," to make sure that we're not dealing with some maintenance issue, I'm asking the question what's included.

MR. ZATARAIN:

Sure. And in the actual asset description, which is part of the application, all the different projects that are actually being done in the upgrade are included in the application. Maybe not on the cover sheet, but the backup, all of the details of every project they did, asset that they bought, was



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1	included in the application.

4	what's included here? Will you have a stack like that

7	vessel can see a 3D model of it as it exists. What it
8	does for my side, it helps with engineering to make sure
9	there's no conflicts when we run piping, when we run
10	railways and stuff. So it's a tool used in the design
11	of the vessels.
12	MR. ADLEY:
13	And so the engineering then, that's part
14	of the manufacturing process?
15	MR. ROUSSEL:
16	Yes, sir. For us. We're a one-stop
17	shop. You come, you get it designed, engineered and
18	built.
19	MR. ADLEY:
20	Okay.
21	On 20151869 in Lafourche.
22	MR. WINDHAM:
23	Larose? Is that the Larose one?
24	MR. ADLEY:
25	Well, I've got a Lafourche one.

22	we're busy, there's two 12-hour shifts, so people are
23	there you know, people actually live on the property.
24	MR. ADLEY:
25	I got you.



1 MR. ROUSSEL: 2 And there's people from all over the state will come down and work, you know, kind of not 3 4 really offshore, but they'll stay there, you know, as long as they're working for us. 5 6 MR. ADLEY: Mr. Chairman, I want to at least mark 7 that as a question for us. I'm not so sure we're 8 convinced that living quarters is part of the actual 9 10 manufacturing process, at least by what we would deem the definition to be. 11 12 MR. WINDHAM: 13 All right. 14 MR. ADLEY: The other one I had was 20151871 also in 15 16 Lafourche and it included office space and I'm trying 17 to, in my mind, understand how that's part of the 18 manufacturing process. 19 MR. ROUSSEL: 20 At that facility is where we're building the US Coast Guard vessels. It's a contractural 21 22 requirement for us to provide office space.

25	I think it's semantics because it's a



1	contractural requirement of the contract. In order to
2	be able to build, you have to provide that space to the
3	government.

5	I got you.
6	And, Mr. Chairman, I think those are the
7	only questions that I had of Bollinger. Just for the
8	record, for 20151871 and 20151869, as we move forward,
9	make sure that they at least record my vote as no. The
10	Governor can try and make his decision about what to do

20	MR. ROUSSEL:
21	Correct. It's an integral part of our
22	business. Without the housing, we don't have the



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workers. Without the workers, we don't have the work.

So from our side -- you know, we respect the opinion of

the Board, but from our side, it's an integral part of

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our business.

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MR. CHABERT:

And I'll just, Mr. Chairman, members of the Board, vouch for the fact this is -- you can go to pretty much any fabrication yard in the lower parts of the state, and, again, Bollinger has a huge facility that they're constructing in Fourchon, and you go across, many of the folks, the tenants at Port Fourchon, they have living quarters on site. Why? Because it's literally at the end of the state. Just to commute there from a place like, say, Golden Meadow; right, which would be the mainland end of Lafourche Parish, it's a 25-minute drive.

So you're talking about making a commute to work that's very difficult for technical-skilled, welders, fitters, fabricators, tackers. It's easier to just actually house them on site for the manufacturing process. And, again, if you don't have the workers, you can't manufacturer the goods. So that's what I'll say in regards to living quarters.

MR. WINDHAM:

Thank you, Senator Chabert.

Mr. Slone.

MR. SLONE:

Senator Chabert just pretty much covered



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1	it because I was thinking inspectors are a part of the
2	protocol also; right? They have to be housed there as
3	you go through your manufacturing process, so they're
4	included in this, the people that stay in this housing
5	also; correct?
6	MR. ROUSSEL:
7	The inspectors don't stay on, but the
8	office space that we provide is for the inspectors for
9	the Coast Guard, who are required to be on site.
10	MR. SLONE:
11	Who are required to be there?

12	or is it onshore?

It's not a requirement that the taxpayer, at least in our views, would exempt that from taxes. It's the idea how to exempt the manufacturing process from taxes and the property associated with that. Every plant requires somebody to work there.

MR. WINDHAM:

Senator Chabert.

MR. CHABERT:

While I agree with my good friend
Senator Adley, when you're talking about contractural
laborers coming in from literally all across the state
and region for the term of the contract, it's difficult
to get workers to relocate permanently to an area. And
I will beg to differ in regard to that that there's
ample housing available to, you know, 150 workers that
are coming in for a specific time or term of a contract.
That's why temporary housing for the actual
manufacturers, the people with the welding masks that
are actually doing the welding, is necessary in order to
manufacture the product.

And it's -- is it onshore/offshore



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thing, this is the only thing that I was trying to
relate that to is the housing for offshore workers on an
Terace that to is the housing for offshore workers on an
offshore rig that are on a seven-and-seven split or a
14-and-7 split, they run those types of operations
onshore at the fabrication facility where they'll hire
Welder John to come in for seven days and work seven
days straight, and then they'll hire Welder Chabert to
come in and work seven days straight. And then he'll go
back to his home in Calcasieu and I'll go back to my
home in Chauvin or what have you and we'll rotate that.
That's what I was trying to equate to inshore/offshore,
which is, again, a very common practice every day, like
every company every day does this.

There's two things, Mr. Adley. First of all, this is an application that was -- an advanced notification that was filed prior to June 24th, so it predates the Executive Order, and the test at that time was do you meet the definition of a manufacturing establishment that's in the constitution. And the test at that time was if you did, then the entire site did qualify. So I'll submit that because this one was grandfathered out of the Executive Order provisions, that the office building qualifies.

Second of all, I do have a copy of the Attorney General's opinion. Although it's very old, it's still in effect, and it does say, "If office or



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administration buildings are essentially and
indispensably an integral or a component part to the
manufacturing enterprise, they may qualify for the
exemption."

So I've got those two reasons for including the office building in this application. And what they did was they expanded their office building. They built their facility in about 2011 or so with a small office building. It's right -- I've been to it. It's attached to the manufacturing building itself.

And then on this application, it's -again, they doubled the size of the existing office
building. The exemption did apply to the first office
building; therefore, we think it should apply to the
expansion of the first office building, especially
because it predates the Executive Order.

MR. WINDHAM:

Thank you, Mr. Allison.

Mr. Adley.

MR. ADLEY:

I just wanted to make a couple comments about I've heard this word "grandfather" used several times. Nothing, nothing was ever grandfathered for prior, new applications. The only grandfathering that has ever been included was for renewals that came in



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under the old rules. This Board has always had and still has the responsibility to determine whether or not items fall inside what you would deem to be manufacturing, and obviously, if you believe office facilities are, then that's how you accordingly should vote.

My directions have been made very clear is that in years past, it is this Governor's view that this Board has become very, very liberal with its interpretation of what the process was. The inclusion of office space was certainly, in our view, part of that liberal interpretation, that it does not fit inside the description of manufacturing process.

Albeit, it's things they've done, Don, in the past, this Board had the responsibility with every new application to determine whether or not they think that it falls in that case.

And on the issue of grandfathering, that discussion relates only to the renewals that we get this meeting, I think, we get 140 of them that the Governor agreed to go ahead and not object to those renewals being renewed. But this is a new application, and as such, the Board has the right to determine whether or not they believe office space is actually part of the operations.



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Baton Rouge, LA 225.751.0732 225.752.7308 FAX I clearly got it when the Coast Guard required it in the contract to inspect their vessels. I got that. But this is office space. This is desks and chairs and things that really have nothing to do, it appears to me, to the manufacturing process.

Mr. Chairman, at least for my
perspective representing the Governor, that we would be
recorded as no on this one. He'll obviously make the
final determination, but we do not believe office space
is appropriate part of the manufacturing process, and in
this application, that's all it is. It's not an
expansion to a line, it's not hiring new people. It's
not doing any of those things. It's just building a new
office building.

MR. ALLISON:

May I respond?

MR. WINDHAM:

Please.

MR. ALLISON:

With all due respect, Mr. Adley, I'm going to try to quote the Executive Order. I believe it's Section 1, and if someone, either with me or not with me, can hand me a copy of the Executive Order, it will certainly be helpful, but if not, I'll try to do it by memory. I'm pretty sure Section 1 of the Executive



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Order clearly states that the provisions of the
Executive Order, it says for applications or contracts
for which an advanced notification form is required, the
Executive Order applies to those contract applications
whose advance notification form is filed after June
24th, 2016. So any applications, whether it's new or a
renewal contract, if the advanced notification is filed
before June 24th, 2016, I think that provision makes it
clear the Executive Order does not apply to it. I think
that's the staff separates the agenda like they do in
one category that we have this one says "Advance
Filed Prior to June 24th, 2016," and the next category
is for "Advance Filed After," and those are the ones
that the Executive Order does apply to, as the Secretary
mentioned at the beginning of the meeting, but not to
the ones on this page.

MR. WINDHAM:

Mr. Miller.

MR. MILLER:

Don, on the application I'm looking at, it has total equipment of \$1.1-million, and then there's a reduction investment that's not to be considered.

What is that equipment?

MR. ALLISON:

The application includes some new



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1	equipment that replaced some old equipment. The new
2	equipment was bigger, more expensive, et cetera, so we
3	had to subtract the cost of the original equipment.
4	MR. MILLER:
5	What is the equipment?
6	MR. ALLISON:
7	It's galvanizing equipment is best I can
8	tell you.
9	MR. MILLER:
10	So you're saying that \$1.1-million worth
11	of equipment was actually manufacturing equipment?
12	MR. ALLISON:
13	Oh, yes, sir. The equipment is
14	MR. MILLER:
15	So just the whole application isn't just
16	a new office building; it's the building at 104,000, and
L7	there was manufacturing equipment at \$1.1-million?
18	MR. ALLISON:
19	I believe it was.
20	MR. MILLER:
21	That's what I'm looking at here.
22	MS. CHENG:
23	The building is only \$100,000, but it
24	was manufacturing equipment, forklifts, bush hogs, that
25	was 1.1-million.



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1	MR. ALLISON:
2	Then we subtracted the cost of what they
3	replaced to come down a to a
4	MR. MILLER:
5	That's what I'm looking at.
6	MR. ALLISON:
7	Yes, sir.
8	MR. WINDHAM:
9	Any other questions, Mr. Miller?
10	MR. MILLER:
11	No. I think I'm good.
12	MR. WINDHAM:
13	Mr. Slone.
14	MR. SLONE:
15	Yeah. I just wanted to ask, Don, what's
16	being done in this building?
L7	MR. ALLISON:
18	Galvanizing.
19	MR. SLONE:
20	Similar to President Miller, but what's
21	the building being used for and what's being done
22	inside? I think that's important.
23	MR. ALLISON:
24	You know, the company and the name
25	indicates it's a galvanizing company. It clearly



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1	qualifies as manufacturer under the definition of
2	manufacturing establishing and under the definition of
3	manufacturing in the new rules.
4	MR. SLONE:
5	But it's all housed under one roof, the
6	office space and the galvanizing operation?
7	MR. ALLISON:
8	As best I can recall, they were attached
9	to the office was one part and the manufacturing
10	establishment was another.
11	I think someone is sitting behind me now
12	that might can help me.
13	MR. SLONE:
14	Because it actually says "New office
15	building to support galvanizing operations," but what
16	are we actually looking at?
17	MR. ALLISON:
18	I'm sorry, Mr. Slone, what was that?
19	MR. SLONE:
20	I was just looking at the application,
21	"New office building to support galvanizing operations."
22	MR. ALLISON:
23	Yes, sir. And Mr. Rengal (sic) behind
24	me was giving me a on galvanizing.
25	They take metal and dip it into



1	different chemicals and things and it coats the metal,
2	and that's called the galvanizing process. It clearly
3	meets the definition of a manufacturing establishment as
4	far as what's the operation that's happening at this
5	facility.
6	MR. WINDHAM:
7	All right. Mr. Slone.
8	MR. SLONE:
9	So that is happening in this new office
10	building?
11	MR. ALLISON:
12	Well, it's all connected. The office
13	building clearly the galvanizing operation could not
14	operate without the office building that supports it.
15	You know, the administrative part of the business has to
16	happen so that the operational part of the business can
17	also happen.
18	MR. SLONE:
19	Thank you.
20	MR. WINDHAM:
21	Thank you.
22	Mr. Adley.
23	MR. ADLEY:
24	Mr. Miller made a really good point in
25	recognizing how much actual equipment was being



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replaced. Albeit, I don't know whether that's maintenance or not. I certainly would not object to approval of this application less the 104,541 for the office space.

Everybody get that no manufacturing, nothing moves unless you've got office space somewhere. We get that. But the constitution clearly says, and this Board got way away from it. That was the Governor's objection all along, that this Board got clearly away from the definition of part of the process of manufacturing, making the product. Desks and chairs and file cabinets are clearly not part of that. So for that reason, we are going to object to it as long as that piece is in there, Don. If that piece were out, we wouldn't object.

I will tell you that when it gets to his desk, you can fight a valiant battle out here if you want to, and this Board can approve it, but you may put at risk of your entire application over \$104,000 in property taxes. I personally wouldn't do that. I can tell you he's been very adamant about the use of office space as part of the manufacturing process.

MR. ALLISON:

I can tell you we've got the Attorney General's opinion that say this stuff qualifies.



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MR. ADLEY:

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Okay.

MR. WINDHAM:

Are there any other questions from the Board concerning this?

MR. ALLISON:

I also, I really believe the grandfathering provision applies. These applications on this page are grandfathered out of the provisions of the Executive Order clearly under the Section 1 of the Order.

MR. ADLEY:

Don, I hear you, but I want to make it very clear to the Board, regardless of what it says, my job is to sit here and represent the Governor's view, and what I'm giving you is his view and you can pass it if you want to. Now, when he disapproves the entire amount, at least let the record reflect that you, Don, had an opportunity to at least remove the \$104,000 office space from the property tax rolls and continue to get a million dollars in property tax exemption. I just -- I don't know. You can push it if you want to, but once it gets up there on his desk, my guess is he's going to say no.

MR. ALLISON:



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1	Okay. My team is telling me to concede
2	here and remove the 104,000 from the application so as
3	not to take the chance that Mr. Adley is describing.
4	MR. WINDHAM:
5	All right. Thank you, Mr. Allison.
6	Mr. Miller.

8	Question. On the building, you have
9	restricted amount on absolute equipment of 741,000. Any
10	of that some of the office or is the office actually

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appears to me. So can you get more specific for me exactly what this one does?

MS. POWERS:

Mr. Adley, my name is Dare Powers, and I'm with Didier Consultants. And first I want to apologize for members of Monsanto not being here. They're having to come from out of state, and there was a travel problem.

This application is probably very unique in that Secretary Pierson and the members of LED spent years working with Monsanto to encourage, convince them to spend \$1-billion and create 100 jobs in St. Charles Parish. This was not an easy feat because it was very competitive. The decision was made, an announcement was made by LED and groundbreaking has taken place. And, also, in the incentive package that was offered to Monsanto, and as we know, these are pre-Executive Orders, the Industrial Tax Exemption was offered.

The 975-million is the project, and we have project description forms. It is all associated with that project and was reviewed by LED when running the return on investment. We can --and I will be glad to go back and to address any questions about any assets, but I want you to know that it has spent years for LED to have this company make this decision, and



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1	this is what we need in this state. And like I said, I
2	will be more than happy to break down any lined item,
3	but that 975,000 or million is associated with the
4	project.
5	MR. WINDHAM:
6	So this is an entirely new operation
7	from the ground up?
8	MS. POWERS:
9	It is a green space in St. Charles.
10	They are developing a new product. It's called Dicamba.
11	It will be made here in Louisiana. It will then be
12	exported to different because of the strength and the
13	intensity, which will give Monsanto the ability to
14	create an entire new product.
15	MR. WINDHAM:
16	So is it fair to say that any and all
17	expenditures of dollars were to establish this
18	manufacturing operation?
19	MS. POWERS:
20	The 975 was, correct, and, like I said,
21	we can go back and look at project descriptions because
22	we had to create them many times because of what was
23	occurring in trying to get the project to come to
24	Louisiana.



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MR. WINDHAM:

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Thank you.

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Mr. Adley.

MR. ADLEY:

When I went through the list of all of the things that were done. I mean, clearly I understand the new boilers and the water capacity and the control room, the maintenance shop. I'm not -- and the new deep well. I'm not so for sure -- I believe the main gate and the upgrade of the internal road system or the new lab.

Now, I do understand -- I want you to make a couple more comments for me about the green space issue. Give me some background on that. That may help me with these other items.

MS. POWERS:

You have ever -- and we would love for you to do this, if you ever came to take a tour of Monsanto, there's an existing facility there. It's been there for years, supports many employees in St. Charles Parish. Obviously there was an additional green space. And what I mean, green space, there was nothing built there, and that was one of positive things when we were negotiating on with LED was negotiating with their project group is that here in St. Charles we had the capacity, we had the land. There was absolutely nothing



on it. If you visited the groundbreaking, there was
nothing but a tent and some beautiful, gold shovels.
There was nothing there. You have to drive past the
existing facility to get to where the new Dicamba
project will be located. So there was nothing to, you
might say, support the new project from the perspective.
Obviously there's some, you know, between the two, but
it was a green space. There's nothing there right now,
or there's starting to be things there, but at the time
that the decision was made.
MR. WINDHAM:

So when you say "green space," you mean there was empty land there? It had be defined -- part of that definition for that manufacturing operation and facility was to put a gate there and put a fence around it so that it could all be established and secured.

MS. POWERS:

Oh, yeah. But it has to have a -because of the type of product, it was a very
different -- you know, it's secured in a different way.

MR. WINDHAM:

Senator Chabert.

In plain speak, there was a cane field that had no cane on it.

12	Good morning. Tom Yura. I'm the Site
13	General Manager for BASF facility in Geismar, Louisiana.
14	When we approached LED, there's two
15	parts to this project. So we have a partnership with
L 6	Praxair. They're going to build a new syngas separation
L7	unit on our site. Our site that we're building that
18	they're building this new syngas separation unit was a
19	green field. So what we have to do as part of our
20	partnership is we have to build all of the utilities, we
21	have to build the pipelines, we have to build the
22	drainage, we have to build the foundations. So this



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partnership is cooperative. So for us, the reason we

had no jobs listed is because this is directly connected

to the Prax. If Prax doesn't come, if they don't build,

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1	if they don't produce the jobs, we obviously get no
2	credit. This is how we split the project up.
3	MR. WINDHAM:
4	You wouldn't spend any money either?
5	MR. YURA:
6	And we wouldn't spend any money because
7	we wouldn't build infrastructure if they weren't going
8	to build a box on top.
9	MR. WINDHAM:
10	Mr. Adley.
11	MR. ADLEY:
12	I got it. Thank you very much.
13	MR. WINDHAM:
L4	Secretary Pierson.
15	SECRETARY PIERSON:
L 6	Mr. Yura?
L7	MR. YURA:
18	Yes?
19	SECRETARY PIERSON:
20	One of the other features that ITEP
21	recognizes is contract workers, which I don't see a
22	column, but I know sometimes when someone will invest
23	maybe 156-million or 32-million, there might be ongoing
24	contract workers that are necessary to do maintenance on
25	these apparatuses over time. Is that a feature?



MR. YURA:

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Contract, of course. I mean, if you look at our site, how we split things up between owner workers and contract workers, we maintain over 500 stable contract workers on our site. By adding new infrastructure that we're going to do, new construction workers, so whether it is with partner, like we have with MMR, with Mike, who provides contract electricians on our site to maintain new transformers, maintain new circuit gear, we'll bring people like that in. And, yeah, you have to increase that body as well.

SECRETARY PIERSON:

I want to bring that into the conversation particularly for, you know, the development professional and some of the other people that work in this arena that that is a feature that is recognized and it is important and at LED, we're going to need to be able to convey that information to the Board in other years.

MR. YURA:

No. And that's a great point. If you talk to many of the contractor firms, I mean, if you look at many of the employee; right, that they have, they'll spend 20 years, 30 years, 40 years coming in and out of the contractor gate to go ahead and provide



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1	necessary maintenance services or other services that we
2	need to stay in existence.
3	SECRETARY PIERSON:
4	We'll certainly be looking for net new,
5	not just retained, like we have in the past, but with an
6	investment like this, it would appear that there
7	MR. YURA:
8	There has to be net new.
9	SECRETARY PIERSON:
10	likely that there's net new.
11	Thank you.
12	MR. WINDHAM:
13	Are there any other or questions for the
14	gentleman from the Board members?
15	(No response.)
16	MR. WINDHAM:

I would like to make a motion that deals with this particular one, and, like I said, those 15 or 16 others that fall in that group, and the motion I would present -- actually, all of the Board members have a copy of it in front of you -- is the motion for the Board's consideration of certain pending applications in light of Board of Commerce and Industry rules -- rules changes taking place on June 20th, 2017. The motion seeks to combine the intent of both the old and new rules and are in the best interest of the State of Louisiana.

Applications meeting the following requirements will be considered by the Board for approval: Number 1, a company's investment or project must be less than \$5-million. Number 2, machinery and equipment will have been purchased, constructed completed and placed in service prior to the Executive Order JBE16-26 dated 6/24/2016. Number 3, Industrial Tax Exemption application for the capital investment set forth in Number 2 above has been submitted by June 19th,



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2017. Number 4, the project subject to the Industrial
Tax Exemption application must have created jobs and has
secured the approval of local government officials,
parish council, school board and sheriff and/or
municipality. That should be added. Number 5, special
consideration will be given to true, value-added capital
investment projects that contribute to the expansion of
new manufacturing or increased production capabilities
in Louisiana. Number 6, the Industrial Tax Exemption
application should expand job opportunities and create
new skills within the Louisiana workforce and bring
commerce to Louisiana that was not present before. And,
finally, Number 7, Board consideration of these
applications will occur through February 2018 Board
meeting, after which point, no further consideration of
these applications will be taken.
That was the motion.

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I want you to know that we do more than this at LED. We've been very active with our small businesses across the State. We're launching roundtables in eight regions right now. I hope you join me on Saturday the 25th in celebrating small business day and actually doing some of your Christmas shopping with local vendors. We're very pleased to make significant progress against our information technology initiative and welcomed DHC in New Orleans on the 13th of November.

We're active with all of the military installations around the state right now and will be bringing back an economic impact report soon, but I can tell you, it's quite significant the importance of Barksdale, the importance of Fort Polk, Belle Chasse, the Coast Guard. We have a great amount of federal dollars that flow to our state that support thousands of jobs that are represented through the Department of Defense, so critical, and we got that on our dashboard as well.

In closing, we didn't speak a lot today about WestRock, but thank you for passing their Industrial Tax Exemption that was supported by all of their local endorsement resolutions that were required. This was a very significant outcome for Jackson Parish,



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and actually the five parishes surrounding in North
Central Louisiana. While there was not a job creation
number that was associated with that investment, I can
assure you that there are hundreds of jobs associated
with harvesting timber, hauling it to the mill and all
of those things that are mill related that keep that
vibrant mill rolling up there. And it competes across
the US and across the globe. There are closed
facilities, and you can easily find them. Fortunately,
this one will remain vibrant for a number of years.

And to Senator Adley's well-stated point, we actually have a contract where we will monitor the number of jobs and the amount of payroll that they continue to produce there going forward to safeguard the public's investment.

But with that, I'll close, and thank you again for your participation in this important process.
