I did receive a call from their consultant saying that she didn't think anyone could make it here from the company or herself. And I told her we needed a request in writing in order for it to be deferred to the next meeting. And I did not receive that request. MR. JONES :

All right then. Ladies and gentlemen, our -- our past back practice, which is not necessarily holding, but our past practice has been, when there's not someone here to help us understand the reason for the late renewal is that the world is your oyster and the Board can do what it pleases with this renewal. We can reduce, we can terminate or refuse to renew. Is -- what is the pleasure of the Board? I -- I -- Ms. -- Ms. Cola? MS. COLA:

Yeah. Just could you remind us in
the past what we've done in terms of -MR. JONES :

When -- usually some -- and -- and this is not about -- we haven't talked about it in a while, so it's not a bad -bad idea to discuss it. When there's a late renewal, basically someone has failed or refused to file for renewal timely. I tell -- it's probably the most valuable incentive programs the State of Louisiana offers. And it has been the practice of the Board that if someone is -- is not going to be paying attention -close enough attention to that contract to file a renewal in a timely way, then it -- it is this Board's interest to know why. Many times, it's because there's been a change in administration, there's been a change in -- in leadership or there's been a change in the person responsible for filing the applications. Sometimes, it's the fault of a consultant, but generally, we have someone here to help us understand what happened. And when someone is not here
to explain, it has been the past practice of this Board, frankly, to deny the renewal. If someone is here to explain, and we are satisfied with that explanation, then they are generally penalized one year for each month that it is late. So --

MS . CHENG :
It's -- it's a year for every year.
MR. JONES :
I'm sorry. Forgive me. I misspoke. Thank you. Keep me between the ditches, Ms. Cheng. Thank you.

All right. So that's -- that's kind of been our practice. That has been where we have been. What is the Board's pleasure today? They have -- this company was told they needed to be here. They were told that if -- if they cannot be here, they have the option to defer. They did not take the opportunity to request a deferral.

Cities Services HWY., Sulphur, Louisiana 70665 in Calcasieu Parish.

MR. JONES :
All right. Do we have a motion to approve?

MR. MOSS :
So moved. So moved.
MR. SIMIEN:
Second.
MR. JONES :
Motion from Mr. Moss. Second from
Mr. Simien. Any questions or comments
from the Board?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Any comments from the public?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, all in favor say, aye.
(All indicated aye.)
MR. JONES :
Any opposition?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
There being none, the motion
carries.
MR. USIE:
Next, we have six special requests.
They're from Centric Pipe, LLC.
(Contracts 20081221-B, 20140501,
20141008, 20180516, 20180516-A and
20200026): LED -- LED received
notification from the Bossier Parish
Assessor that the manufacturing
establishment located at 430 Hamilton
Road, Bossier City, Louisiana was not
currently operational. ITEP Rules
require any changes in operations at the contract site to be reported to the Board of Commerce and Industry.

LED subsequently received a letter
from Centric Pipe stating that
manufacturing at the facility was temporarily idled on August 21st, 2021. They are requesting that the Board of Commerce and Industry consider keeping their active contracts in place while their facility is temporarily idle. The company is expecting to reopen the mill in Q1 of 2022.

MR. JONES :
Do we have anyone here from Centric Pipe?

MR. PLUMBER:
Right here?
MR. JONES :
Yeah. That'd be fine.
MR. PLUMBER:
Good morning.
MR. JONES :
Good morning. Could you just state
your name, your position with the
company, please, for the record?
MR. PLUMBER:
Jeff Plumber. I'm the CFO at
Centric Pipe.
MR. JONES :
Right. Tell us what's going on, Mr. Plumber.

MR. PLUMBER:
Well, I wrote a letter. We were contacted by the local taxing authorities saying that we were out of compliance with the contracts that we had in place for -- for the tax abatements, I think -I'm not an expert in this area by any means .

But, you know, we're a small company and we're in the steel and energy industry. So we've had kind of a -until lately a -- a pretty rough time of it. So we had to idle that facility in August. Since then -- we're going to start the mill back up in March and rehire about 50 people back in that area. Most of these people have worked with us for a long time.

In my letter, you know, I'm not here to say that we did it correctly, okay? I'm just here to say that this help would -- would really help us get the facility back up and running and re-employee the people and all this kind of stuff. And internally, what we've done is, put in place a better process where I'm the contact person and we can stay on top of this.

I mean, that's -- that's essentially what happened. MR. JONES :

So -- to make sure I understand. So on August 31, the company had to make the decision to go idle due to demand -market demand?

MR. PLUMBER:
Yeah. In our industry -- so we -we weld -- we do ERW pipe, which is -which is -- it -- it's an oil and gas OCTG tubing and casing that goes down oil wells. And so anybody that's in that industry there -- there's a CRU index for hot rolled coils. So that per ton cost
went up from year -- every year from like $\$ 700$ to $\$ 1,900$.

So effectively, like if you go back and look at like Tenaris, the biggest one in the world that does this, the CEO got on there and said, well, there's no one that's going to be producing this domestically in the US without some help.

And so everybody was kind of in the same condition. We had the pandemic going, we had people not in the office, all this kind of stuff going on, so we idled the mill.

We -- we retained our core employees, you know, the general manager and these kind of people. The long-term production people that we had there, which most of these people have been there for ten plus years, we acquired it in 2013, but they were there even before that, we -- some of them, we found temporary jobs. We tried to place them in different -- you know, help them out and everything.

And so now, they have $\$ 82$ oil and
the price of the coils have gone down to about $\$ 1,100$. But what's happened is, because no one produced any pipe for so long, there's a big shortage, so the margins have increased dramatically so it makes sense for us to put the mill back on the line, and that's what we're doing. So --

MR. JONES :
Couple more questions, just to give us some better insight into the company. How long has the company been in operation?

MR. PLUMBER:
Well, we acquired it from a company based in Portland, Oregon called North West Pipe in 2013. Before that, I think they were there like ten years. And before that, the mill was actually built in like 1972.

MR. JONES :
So it's been around for a long time.
MR. PLUMBER:
Yeah. So these -- so these production employees, you know, the
foremen and everything and like that, they've been there for a long, long time.

So --
MR. JONES :
How many total employees does the facility have?

MR. PLUMBER:
Well, we're -- we -- we -- you know,
it was on a downturn, so we had 50. So we had to reduce it down to about -well, we -- we laid off 50 in August. We had some shipping people there and stuff that still shipped out pipe that was still in the yard and stuff like that. So we're -- we're putting back on the first shift at the end of March, which will be the 50 people coming back. But the -- but the market's so good that we're probably going to put on a second shift and maybe a third. So in total, you could see 100, 120 people. MR. JONES :

All right. Any other questions concerning this -- and again, what they're essentially asking with --
they're -- what -- what happens folks, under -- under the rules, when a company goes idle, there's supposed to be a notification so that -- so that LED understands that they have in fact gone idle.

So essentially what's happened here, they failed to do so. Should have done so, failed to do so. And so that's what brings us here today.

The way LED found out about it is, the tax assessor realized it had happened and -- and actually contacted us. So -so now, we -- I think -- I think what Mr. --

MR. PLUMBER:
Plumber.
MR. JONES :
Thank you. Is -- is telling us is, now we realize we should have done it and we're -- we're about to go back into operations at the end of this quarter, sometime in March. So the -- your alternatives, as I see them, you can -we can shut down the contract. That is
one option, because they failed to follow the rules, or we can waive that and allow them to continue under the contract because of the situation.

MR. NASSAR:
I make a motion that we waive -that we waive it and we allow them to continue under the contract.

MR. JONES :
Okay. We have a motion to allow the contract to continue.

MR. SAIZAN :

## SECOND :

MR. JONES :
We have a second from Mr. Saizan.
Any questions or comments from the Board?
MR. EITMANN :
I have -- I have a question.
MR. JONES :
Sure. Go right ahead. Please, speak into the mic.

MR. EITMANN:
Thank you. How long have ya'll been participating in the ITEP program? MR. PLUMBER:

When we made the acquisition, there were already some contracts in place, because I think the contracts -- the nomenclature, the ID's, are like the year. So like even on this list, it's like 2008. And so you can see when we came in here, 2014 and 2018 and 2020, but they had some even before that, I think. MR. EITMANN:

And you feel comfortable today saying that -- that -- that the company has taken steps to ensure that the -- the local assessor won't have to notify this Board of noncompliance again? MR. PLUMBER:

Or it -- I -- I can assure you on that, because now, I'm personally involve -- now, I know the assessor's personally and everything. I can assure you that we will be in compliance.

MR. EITMANN :
All right. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
Thank you.
MR. JONES :
Thank you. Any other questions or
comments from the Board?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Good. Any comments from the public?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, we have a motion to
waive the penalty and allow the contract
continue. All in favor say, aye.
(All indicated aye.)
MR. JONES :
Any opposition?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, the motion carries.
MR. PLUMBER:
Thank you very much.
MR. JONES :
Thank you. Appreciate you being
here today. Get those people back to work.
MR. PLUMBER:
That's right. That's what we're doing.
MR. JONES :

All right. Next.
MR. USIE:
Next, we have one noncompliant contract that follows the 2017 rules. It is for Inferno Manufacturing, 20161891, in Caddo Parish. The reporting period was for 2017. The company was required to create three jobs with a total of 200,000 in payroll. They created the three jobs, but only created 56,910 in payroll.

MR. JONES :
Okay.
MR. USIE:
LED received notification from the two entities that approved the contract initially. The parish and police jury chose to defer to the Board. The School Board didn't approve the exemption. The sheriff didn't approve the exemption initially. The municipality, they were notified, and we did not receive any response. MR. JONES :

When you say they did not approve
the exemption initially, is that on -the -- the very first --

MR. USIE:
The original contract, so they didn't need to be notified of noncompliance because it was never approved from the start.

MR. JONES :
Okay. And the -- the two that did approve -- or the parish police jury, they actually deferred us to -- defer to the Board?

MR. USIE:
Correct.
MR. JONES :
Okay. Thank you very much. Do we have someone here from the company? Please come forward. If you'll state your name and position with the company, please?

MR. ORGANICK:
Good morning, my name is Allen Organick. I'm the president and owner of Inferno. MR. JONES :

Okay. So essentially what we have here, you -- under the original contract, you have an obligation or responsibility to create three jobs, which apparently you did under the rules, but there was a -- a shortfall in the total payroll for those three jobs. Can you kind of tell us what -- what happened here?

MR. ORGANICK :
Yes. We bought the machine in December of 2016 and completed the installation a couple of weeks later. So LED calculates that our first year of obligation is 2017, but it took us six months before we hired the first person and then in a couple of months later, we hired another and then another. And so the payroll numbers reflect that, less than a full year -- less than a full calendar year. In addition, the -- when we -- when we made our application, we made it for in two phases. One phase in 2016 and the next phase the next year. And during the application process, for the first go around, the application
guide, computer software, gave us messages saying that this is phase one and we -- we put down two new employees, $\$ 145,000$. So our numbers don't agree with the -- the contract.

MR. JONES :
Okay. All right. Ms. Bourgeois, you've come to the table, so $I$ have a feeling you want to tell me something. MS . BOURGEOIS:

I really just have it in a recap, because I know we talked a lot about this last time.

I'm Tam Bourgeois, Counsel for the Board. There's a lot of discussion, so I just wanted to briefly summarize that they're here today because of noncompliance in their first year. They created the jobs but not the payroll. And it -- it is because they hired those employees midyear. It wasn't caught in the contracting process that that was, you know, the actual plan. The contract is the contract.

As of now, as I understand it,
they're employing more people than they originally promised. And just to expand upon -- I know the -- the letter from the police jury says that they fully endorse the company's continued participation in the program. So I just wanted to kind of --

MR. JONES :
Well, one thing -- for -- for the Board, just to -- and this is something that I -- I'm not real crazy about, about the program, but it's -- it's the way it works and I'm -- I'm not -- there may be a better way to do it, but I'm not smart enough to figure it out. But when we -when -- when these companies have to estimate the -- the payroll, basically the -- it's a 12 month payroll. And so if you hire someone in July, I mean, you're paying them a $\$ 100,000$, well, you're -- you've committed yourself to a $\$ 100,000$ payroll, but yet, you only pay 50 because they came in midyear. So while from a -- from an employers perspective they -- they hired the
employee that they agreed to hire. They paid them the salaries they agreed to pay them, and based on their math, yeah, we -- we've got three employees making what we promised to pay them, but yet, because we hired them later in the year, the total payroll for that year falls short.

So I -- I -- and -- and staff stop
me if I'm -- if I'm out of bounds here,
but I think that's the -- the pothole we've found ourselves in, in this situation; is that correct? Is that correct, staff?

MR. USIE:
(Indicated a positive response.)
MR. JONES :
Yes, okay. All right. Now, Mr.
Organick, you had something else you wanted to add?

MR. ORGANIC:
Yes. The way LED treats our -- the audit, they give us -- they give us credit for all three people that we hired, but they don't give us credit for the payroll dollar, so it's -- it's
inconsistent. Why give us three credits if we -- if they average out less than three --

MR. JONES :
Yeah. And I -- like I say, under -it's actually -- it's actually amounts paid during the year and when you hire people late in the year, you might -they're not going to get a 100 percent of the salary, because they got hired late in the year. So I understand the problem. Great thing about coming before the Board is that we have an opportunity to do what may be the right thing, if -if that is the Board's desire.

And -- and we -- so we have a situation where the -- that the company met the obligation to hire the people and they agreed -- and they're paying them the salary they agreed to pay them. It's just that first year, they didn't come in until later in the year, so -- Mr. Pierson? MR. PIERSON:

Just want to add the comment to the
record that we are not inconsistent. We are very consistent. We don't make the numbers. We read the numbers. The payroll figures come to us through another branch of government, Department of Revenue. We see the salaries paid, and the staff is just required to tell you what the numbers are. So I didn't want to let a floating comment about, you know, we have three people, but we have 56,000 in payroll. We're just telling you what the numbers reflect. MR. JONES :

Great. All right. So the -- we have an opportunity here to -- we can penalize the company or we can waive the penalty and allow the contract to move forward without penalty. What is the pleasure of the Board? Do we have a motion?

MR. NASSAR:
I make a motion we waive the penalty. MR. JONES :

I have a motion from Mr. Nassar to
waive the penalty.
MR. SIMIEN:
Second.
MR. JONES :
We have a second. Was that Mr.
Simien?
MR. SIMIEN :
(Indicated a positive response.)
MR. JONES :
Got a second from Mr. Simien. Any
questions or comments from the Board?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Any comments from the public?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, all in favor say, aye.
(All indicated aye.)
MR. JONES :
Any opposition?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
There being none, the motion
carries.
MR. ORGANICK :

Thank you.
MR. JONES :
Thank you, Mr. Organick. Good to see you, sir.

MR. ORGANICK :
Thank you.
MR. JONES :
Thank you, sir.
All right. What do we have next?
MR. USIE:
Next, we have noncompliant contracts following the 2018 rules. The first company is A.O.U.O.P.S., Inc., in East Carroll Parish. It is two contracts, 20170103 and 201701030-A. 20170103, the first year of noncompliance is the 2018 year. They were required to create five jobs with 50,000 in payroll. They only -- they created four jobs with salaries of 88,191 in payroll. And the local entities were notified. And the parish police juries, school board and sheriff all made recommendations to defer to the Board.

The next contract is 2017013 again.

This one is for the 2020 reporting period. They were required to create five jobs. They had a ramp up in payroll, so it was now 125,000 in payroll. The actual jobs created were zero with no payroll and the sheriff -sheriff, school board and parish -parish all defer to Board for that year as well.

The last year is for the contract 20170103-A for the 2020 calendar year. They were required the five jobs at 125,000. And it was zero and zero jobs and payroll actually created. And the parish, police jury, school board and sheriff defer to Board for that year as well.

MR. JONES :
All right. Do we have anyone here
from A.O.U.O.P.S.?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
All right. You -- you -- I think each of you -- the Board members should have at your desk a copy of an email
chain, actually from the ownership of the company. And actually this was sent in preparation for the December meeting, which did not take place. This is from the secretary treasurer -- I don't know if that's a Mr. or Ms. Lee --

MR. USIE:
Ms.
MR. JONES :
Ms. -- Ms. Lee Shumate. And I'll --
I'll let you read it yourself, but essentially, the -- this is a -- they -they cannot -- because they are a small company, they simply cannot come to Baton Rouge for the meeting. They -- they've had some illness issues. They had a facility that actually burned down when they -- and as they were trying to rebuild, they ran into issues there in East Carroll Parish, which they say is a poor parish and they're having frankly a difficult time getting people back to -to come to work, which has led to the situation. And then compound, in 2020, of course, Covid made the whole situation
that much more complicated.
So I'll let you read the emails yourself, but that is the essence of -of -- of what they're saying. They have been -- basically, said we can't come to the meetings, but we're asking for a reprieve the Board.

Ms. Bourgeois, do you have anything to add, or you're just here to answer questions?

MS . BOURGEOIS :
I'm here to answer questions.
MR. JONES :
Great. Thank you so much.
So what is the pleasure of the
Board?
MR. HOLLEY:
I have a question.
MR. JONES :
Yes, sir. Mr. Holley?
MR. HOLLEY:
Ms. -- Ms. Bourgeois, was there any
one year that they were in compliance?
MR. USIE:
They were in -- in compliance for
the 2019 year. So that's why you'll see the first one was 2018. They were short one job, which made them noncompliant. 2019 is not shown on here for either contract, because they were compliant for that year. And then they went back to noncompliant for the 2020 year for both contracts. And both of those contracts cover one project. The age just indicates that it's a phase. So as -- as we're placing the service in two different calendar years, but it was one project, one set of job creation requirements.

MR. JONES :
So apparently, they -- the way I interrupt that -- and stop me if I'm wrong. But the way $I$ interrupt that in 27 or 20 -- excuse me -- 2018, they were starting up with -- with under the contract. They were obligated to -- to hire five people. They hired four, but they exceeded the payroll obligation. 2019, they met their obligations. Both five -- they had five employees at over -

Folks, I -- I think one of the things that we are dealing with and -and as we -- you know, we're -- we're relatively new into the compliance game as a Board. Ya'll know that we've only -- it's only the third -- second or third meeting that we've actually had compliance items on the agenda that we've had to deal with. This is not -- this is the first time we've seen Covid being raised at the level it's being raised, but I don't believe it'll be the last time.

So for whatever that's worth, it -it's something that -- and -- and again, I think we -- when we started this process of dealing with compliance, we had much discussion at this Board about arbitrary and capricious and -- but at the same time, we don't want to have cookie cutter answers because every project is different. Every situation is different. And that's why it's important for us to delve into what the facts are
and what happened and why it happened. Some -- some reasons for meeting the contract are appropriately excused, some reason are not. And it is -- it's up to this Board to make those determinations.

So you have a set of facts in front of you, based on the emails and discussions we've had this morning, so we need to make a decision. What is the pleasure of the Board?

MR. HOLLEY:
May I ask one more question, please?
MR. JONES :
Sure.
MR. HOLLEY:
If $I$ understand it, no taxing authority has opposed the continuation of this program; is that correct? MR. USIE:

That's correct. All they did was -they did all send the response. Their response was just to defer to the Board for the decision.

MR. HOLLEY:
Okay.

MR. NASSAR:
Make a motion that we grant a reprieve for the company.

MR. JONES :
All right. And we have a motion from Mr. Nassar to grant the reprieve and allow the contract to go on, but continue without penalty.

MR. MOSS :
Second.
MR. JONES :
We have a second from Mr. Moss. Any
questions or comments from the Board?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Any comments from the public?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, all in favor say, aye.
(All indicated aye.)
MR. JONES :
Any opposition?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
There being none, the motion
carries. And you will communicate that to the -- Ms. Shumate?

MR. USIE:
(Indicated a positive response.)
MR. JONES :
Thank you.
MR. USIE:
The next company is Oil \& Grit, LLC
in East Feliciana Parish. Contract 20170302.

The first noncompliant reporting period is the 2019 year. The company was required to create six new jobs with 266,000 in payroll. The actual jobs created were five and the payroll was 153,460. And the local entities were notified. The parish, the school board and the sheriff. No response was received.

For the 2020 reporting period for the same contract 20170302, they were required to create six jobs, 266,000 in payroll. The local entities were notified and the jobs and salary are unknown because the company did not sub -

- submit annual compliance for that year for it to be determined.

MR. JONES :
Okay. Do we have anyone here from Oil \& Grit, LLC.? Ms. Boatner? Please state your name and your relationship with the company, please.

MS. BOATNER:
Rhonda Boatner, Didier Consultants.
We are the consultant for this company.
Unfortunately, because of Covid, this facility has closed down. They are not operational. That's the reason we don't have any reporting for 2020 is because they no longer have any employees.

So based on the rules of the program -- and they have no plans to re-open the facility. They are -- they are hoping to sell it. So based on the program rules, you know, it's -- it's the Board's decision as to whether or not we should continue with the ITEP.

MR. JONES :
All right. There we go. What is
the pleasure of the Board?
MR. HOLLEY:
I -- I move that we terminate the program.

MR. JONES :
We have a motion to terminate.
MR. SIMIEN :
Second.
MR. JONES :
We have a second from Mr. Simien.
Any questions or comments from the Board?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Any comments from the public?
MS . BOATNER:
I would like to make one more comment, please.

Just for clarification purposes, the
total investment is the 3.2 million, not the sum. Because if you look at the totals number at the bottom, it seems to reflect that they invested six million dollars, and in fact, it's only 3.2 million. MR. JONES :

Good. Thank you. All right. We have a motion and a second to terminate the contract. Any other questions or comments from the Board?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Any comment form the public?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, all in favor say, aye.
(All indicated aye.)
MR. JONES :
Any opposition?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
There is no opposition, the motion carries. Thank you, Ms. Boatner. MS . BOATNER :

Thank you.
MR. USIE:
And that concludes the ITEP portion of the agenda.

MR. JONES :
Thank you. Thank you both.
All right. Do we have any other
business?
(No response.)
MR. JONES :
Hearing none, Mr. Pierson, the floor
is yours. Bring us up to date.
MR. PIERSON :
Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And I'll be brief, but appreciate the opportunity to update the -- the Board.

We are finishing up, as you know, 2021, and we've had a remarkable year. Remarkable in that, sustaining hurricanes and major storms. Remarkable in the backdrop of the pandemic impacting companies, as you've heard here today. But despite that, a record year for economic development in our state. Projects in 31 parishes. 6,700 new direct jobs creating 11,400 indirect jobs. 9,700 retained jobs through projects that we can point to and a committed capital investment in our state of 20.6 billion. So just things headed in a very favorable direction, particularly the construction industries
and a wide portfolio of opportunities out there.

Notably, awarded by US Department of Commerce two Build Back Better Phase One application for awards. 529 communities across the nation submitting. 60 being selected. And Louisiana having two of those. One around the energy pivot and the formation of the hydrogen economy, reliance more so on renewables, reduction in greenhouse gases and wind, solar and other renewables coming together to help power that. That will be lead by the Greater New Orleans, Inc., but it's a regional program.

Also, the second one will be led by the New Orleans Bio Innovation Center, but it's around a health corridor that stretches from Baton Rouge, Pennington Health District to New Orleans Tulane Medical School, Louisiana Health Science Center, New Orleans Bio Innovation Center and -- and all the rural areas in this -- in this region. Though these two awards carried a $\$ 500,000$ reward to
further define, develop plans going forward, but importantly, represent the opportunity to compete for the phase two award. These 60 communities will be narrowed to 30 final award winners that can receive up to 100 million dollars, so we're -- we're being seen nationally for some excellence being represented through these programs.

The other very significant event that is upon us here in 2022 in a favorable way is funds that will be awarded by the US Treasury where we've submitted application for and have an allocation of 74 million dollars, and that number may be enhanced, that is being provided in order to accelerate entrepreneurship and support of small businesses across the state. Those funds will be deployed through Louisiana Economic Development Corporation, which is a segment of LED's management that works with a board appointed by the Governor. And the funds have been awarded once, not too long ago, 09 and

10 in the post building housing bubble burst where the economy was struggling and funds were awarded. And Louisiana did a great job of the deployment of those funds, largely through our banks where we participated with Louisiana Banks on a loan guarantee program, but also placing money in Venture Capital funds that were established.

We've been in strong conversation with stakeholders and preparing for this next round of investment by the Treasury. And so a significant of influx of funds will hopefully arrive later in the summertime or thereabouts.

We'll be able to again, make some Venture Capital investments. We will be able to reinforce our loan guarantee program. And importantly, whenever you take federal monies, they come with the federal reporting requirements and other guidance that you have to comply with, but one of the elements here will be to try to reach out to a lot of underserved populations or distressed small business
across our state and come with what we'll call micro lending, smaller less documentation, easier to support and even some collateral substitution programs where funds can be put up so that a company that's strapped for assets may not have collateral and may typically be turned down by the bank will -- will qualify.

So I think for hard hit areas from the storm damage, such as the Southwest Louisiana, a lot of recovery ongoing down the bayou, we're going to have some great opportunities to support and assist these small businesses. It'll be a -- a new feature. Not specifically new, I told you we'd been awarded funding of this nature before, but the segment of micro lending and I think a more focused approach for distressed segments of our economy are going to be new features that'll be developed and deployed.

So with that, I'll conclude my remarks. And if you have any questions, I'd be happy to try to answer them.
