5 we have since done a full audit of our system and
6 confirmed that there's no other issues so it will
7 not happen again.
8 CHAIRMAN JONES: All right. Okay.
9 Under the -- this is for the board, just to remind
everyone, this is a pre-EO application. So under
post-EO, we have rules that dictate what the
penalties will be. The penalties for pre-EO are
purely at the discretion of the board. So as you
can see, options of the board, we can approve the renewal, the five-year renewal with a penalty. We
can approve it without a penalty, we can approve
it with a penalty, or we can deny the request for
renewal. So as I'm fond of saying, the world is
our oyster in these circumstances, although it has
been our custom to apply a one-year penalty on the
late renewals. So what is the pleasure of the board?

MR. SHOCKEY: My name is Bill Shockey.
I'm a lawyer here in Baton Rouge, Shockey \&
5 Associates, and we serve as consultants to
6 Kerotest on this project. I know you would rather
7 hear from a company representative than a paid
8 mouthpiece like me. Mr. Chris -- the company is
headquartered in Pittsburgh. The major
operations, 80 or 90 percent of the company's
operations, are here in Louisiana in Mansura, which is in Avoyelles Parish.

Mr. Chris White, who is the president and CFO both, to give you an idea of how small the management team is, injured his back either
Sunday or Monday and is laid up and couldn't make the trip. And so he called me -- I know you'd rather hear from a company representative.

CHAIRMAN JONES: That's all right.
Thank you for that explanation though.
MR. SHOCKEY: But that's why I'm here
today is to give, you know --
CHAIRMAN JONES: That's all right. I
have no prejudice against lawyers.
MR. SHOCKEY: I understand, but I do,
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and I'm a lawyer and I'm prejudiced against
lawyers. I was surprised by Hud's comment about
the jobs that were reported because I thought the
figure was much higher than the -86 or
something?
MR. USIE: 86 jobs, correct.
CHAIRMAN JONES: Yeah, the problem is, the sheet I'm looking at is showing zero jobs and zero salaries. I don't understand where the numbers --

MR. USIE: So that's because the way the Exhibit A agreement was written is they have to maintain a total of 185 jobs, but that 185 is split between 155 being retained as existing prior to the project starting, and then 30 being created new after the project started. And the payroll of 634,000 is associated with only the new jobs. They don't have a set payroll for the retention only. So they didn't meet the 155 retained jobs, which is why the summary shows zero, zero.

CHAIRMAN JONES: Okay. So, let's get our data correct, then we can figure out what we're going to do about it.

So they did not retain the original 155. Were the 30 new jobs added?
back in 2020 --
CHAIRMAN JONES: I've slept since then.
MR. SHOCKEY: -- with lots of other
companies.
CHAIRMAN JONES: Right.
MR. SHOCKEY: And so it's been quite a
chore to get back to Ground Zero, so we -- meaning
where we were prior to 2020 in order to progress
from there.
The jobs I have reported to me in the
most recent -- in the Certificate of Compliance
is the company has 127 full-time employees.
That's in the Certificate of Compliance which
was filed.
CHAIRMAN JONES: Got it.
MR. SHOCKEY: And the payroll reported
for those employees was $\$ 4,547,339$. Admittedly,
we fall short on both the number of jobs and the
payroll. But we're close in terms, particularly
on the payroll. The bench- -- of course, the
contract provides you're in default if you don't
achieve 90 percent. And if we look at that
benchmark, we're only 4.6 percent off in terms of
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the payroll -- I'm sorry. We're actually above
that, by 4.06 percent, but we are below in the
jobs retained. Now, the -- and again --
CHAIRMAN JONES: Let me stop you there,
Mr. Shockey, because I want to make sure I
understand. So you're talking about jobs
retained.
MR. SHOCKEY: Yes, sir.
CHAIRMAN JONES: Did we create the 30
new jobs at all or is that off the table?
MR. SHOCKEY: Well, if you -- I would
say it's off the table in the sense of we don't
have more people employed today than we -- we
haven't met the 185.
CHAIRMAN JONES: That's my simplistic
way of looking at it but I wanted to make sure I
wasn't missing something.
MR. SHOCKEY: Right. Despite best
efforts, we don't have the 185 on payroll at this
point.
CHAIRMAN JONES: Okay. I'm with you.
MR. SHOCKEY: The payroll is edged up
for a number of reasons because despite not
achieving the employee threshold, because of
higher wages being offered to induce hires and
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1 inflation and things of that nature. There are
four local governmental entities which have a say
3 in this, if you will -- sheriff, police jury, the
4 school board, and the town of Mansura, because the
5 plant is actually located within the town of
6 Mansura. The school board, the police jury and
7 the sheriff have all chosen to do nothing, to ride
8 it out. They had no response. It's only the town
9 of Mansura who has asked for, if you will, the
10 death penalty. I mean, they're asking for
11 cancellation of the contract.
12 If we -- yes, they have a stake. But
13 if we look at the assessment, and I have 20
14 copies here I can pass out if you'd like, but
15 the assessment from the assessor for the 2018
16 expansion of the Kerotest plant shows that the
17 total taxes exempted are $\$ 62,474$ for the year
18 2021. Of that, the town of Mansura would've
19 collected $\$ 5,068$, or 8.1 percent thereof. They
20 are the minor player in this from the standpoint
21 of local governmental entities.
22 The resolution, which was adopted on
23 the February 13 meeting that's been provided to
24 you, in which the town of Mansura asked for
25 cancellation of the contract, was done with no
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notice to Kerotest and no opportunity to be
heard, which are just basic fundamental
principles that we in our American system tend
to observe. There's apparently some sort of
disconnect between Kerotest and the town administration.

I was involved in getting the local
approval back in 2018, but there's been a
complete turnover in the town administration
since then, a different mayor and four of the
five members of the Board of Aldermen are
ultimately different. I'm not a local guy. I
don't have political stroke there. I tried to
seek out somebody for them who can. But nevertheless, it's my understanding, they can't
even get an audience with the town of Mansura in
order to state their case -- meaning, Kerotest
representatives -- to state their case, et cetera.

So I would suggest that given the fact
that we're close -- admittedly, we haven't
achieved our jobs and payroll requirements.
That recovery is still ongoing from COVID,
people trying to get back to Ground Zero and
improve from there, and that only the smallest

1 stakeholder, the town of Mansura, is wanting to
exact their pound of flesh or ounce of blood. I
would suggest cancellation as a penalty far
beyond the default, if you will. It would be
like imposing the death penalty for some
criminal offense where somebody was good
intentioned but committed an intentional
violation of the law. I mean, it's said that
close only counts in hand grenades and horse
shoes, right, and I would suggest, however, that
in your discretion or your indulgence, you would
permit close to count this time.
CHAIRMAN JONES: I mean, obviously 2021
was a tough year for a lot of companies. We've
had many come across with 2020 and 2021 being
difficult years to maintain, much less grow their
numbers. But we also have a dynamic where, at least from the Chair's perspective, and this is just one person's opinion. But when local government chooses not to respond, that tells me that they either don't care, or are willing to do whatever this board is willing to do.

So, but by the same token, when a local entity expresses its opinion, I think -unless there's a compelling reason to do so,

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it's incumbent upon this board to follow that
recommendation. So, with that, I would
entertain a motion. Mr. Hollins, do you have a question?

MR. HOLLINS: Before we make the motion, Chair, I know this was a conversation last time. Is anyone from the municipality here?

CHAIRMAN JONES: Anybody here from the town of Mansura? Apparently not. All right. So do we have a motion to be made at this point?

3 the company create and maintain 10 jobs with
$4 \$ 300,000$ in payroll. The actual jobs created was
5 three, with $\$ 337,081$ in payroll. The parish,
school board, nor sheriff submitted
recommendations. The City of West Monroe
8 submitted a recommendation stating to defer any
decision or action on the noncompliance to the 10 board.
11 CHAIRMAN JONES: All right. Will you 12 state your name and position with the company, 13 please.
14 MS. HYMAN: Meranda Hyman, CFO. 15 CHAIRMAN JONES: Okay. Great. And -16 MR. WEGE: Robert Wege with Sumit 17 Credits.
18 CHAIRMAN JONES: Thank you, Robert. All
19 right. Tell us what happened here in 2021.
20 MS. HYMAN: Again, as everyone has kind
21 of stated, COVID. I mean, we had the jobs
22 available. We held internal job fairs. We had 60
23 people show up. We worked with locals and
24 attended their job fairs. We just could not get
25 the people. We have increased wages and

1 everything to try to promote jobs. We actually
worked with temporary services as well. We had a
lot of temp labor. I believe a couple years ago,
we actually went through about 250 temporary
laborers in 2021.
As she indicated, we only did add
three employees; however, we did meet the
payroll. And looking forward into 2022,
preliminarily I'm happy to report that we added
15 employees with 356,000 in payroll.
CHAIRMAN JONES: Well, good. Because that was my question, did you see a difference in hiring between 2021 and 2022?

MS. HYMAN: We did, yes, sir. Yeah, at some expense because we had to raise salaries and things of that nature, but yes, sir, we did.

CHAIRMAN JONES: Right. Interesting. Okay. And 2023, you're maintaining the jobs so far?

MS. HYMAN: Yes, we on average of about 80 employees total.

CHAIRMAN JONES: Great.
MR. NASSAR: I'll make a motion that we approve with no penalty.

CHAIRMAN JONES: All right. We have a

motion from Mr. Nassar. Second? Second from
Mr. Hollins. Any questions or comments from the
board? There being none, any comments from the
public? Hearing none, all in favor, say aye.
(AYES BY ALL.)
CHAIRMAN JONES: Any opposition? There
being none, the motion carries. Thank you.
Appreciate it. Good luck.
All right, ladies and gentlemen, that
brings us to the end of our business for the
board, but we have, instead of the $B$ team, we
have the A team representing the Department,
Assistant Secretary Anne Villa here for the
secretary.
UNDERSECRETARY VILLA: Just for the record, undersecretary.

CHAIRMAN JONES: Undersecretary.
Forgive me.
UNDERSECRETARY VILLA: I've been called
many things. But undersecretary.
CHAIRMAN JONES: All right.
UNDERSECRETARY VILLA: Anne Villa, at
the pleasure. The secretary would like to, of
course, extend his regrets for not being here
today, but expresses his sincere gratitude to the
continued work of the BC\&I board members and
staff. We recognize this sometimes can be a heavy
3 lift for everybody but we strive to provide you
4 with sufficient details on the applications and
are always available should you have any
6 questions. The BC\&I team does yeoman's work on
7 many of the programs administered for the board.
8 There's a lot of hard work that goes into
9 reviewing those applications prior to submitting
them to the board for approval, and we just want
to extend a sincere thanks for their commitment to LED and the board.

Additionally, to the many businesses
which continue to grow and invest in Louisiana,
we thank you. We just finished our fiscal year
23 and we continue to see momentum in the number
7 of projects and investments that have been made
in Louisiana. The metrics are still being
vetted, but I'm certain the secretary will be
able to share those with you next month at
August's board meeting, which seems to be a
lengthy one versus the one today.
Just to highlight a few recent
announcements we've had: 360insights, a global software company, announces relocation of its

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headquarters from Delaware to New Orleans.
They'll be creating at least 50 new direct jobs
at an annual of 85,000 . They currently have
locations in the US, Canada, and the United
Kingdom. And they service more than 300 brands
across a variety of industries worldwide.
A\&B Industries invests $\$ 12$ million to
create a second manufacturing facility near
Houma and they are going to expect to create
about 70 new direct jobs.
Capitol City Produce announced the $\$ 22$
million expansion of their Baton Rouge
distribution facility here, and they're
retaining their current 258 jobs. And they
estimate to have new -- 81 new indirect jobs,
for a total of 126 new jobs in the capital region.

SSE Steel Fabrication acquires state-of-the-art technology for St. Bernard expansion. And they are expected to create new jobs there as well in their technology advances at the plant, and will continue to add a fleet of welding, collaborative robots and cobots for their facility, but they will create 18 new direct jobs.

1 2 to Abbeville in 2024, and they are going to
begin operations in ' 24 , as I said, and their
facility there is going to be The Last Mile
facility. It's expected to increase -- have an
economic boost to the region, creating new jobs during and after construction of the facility.

Recently, Louisiana has taken a
number one place ranking for the talent pipeline
category. The state moved up from second place
in 2022 to the top spot, which recognizes an
impressive and proactive focus that we have had
on expanding the skill tech workforce through
programs that are quickly and effectively
delivering results. So, that was a nice win for
us at the state level.
So Natchitoches recently was named the
Louisiana Development Ready Community. Our team
works with communities to help them establish
goals and strategies for strategic plan that
would move the parish forward through job
creation and investment. And they were our 56,
I'm pretty certain, parish or municipality to receive the state certification.

And also just to continue our outreach
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regarding our State Small Business Credit
Initiative, which is overseen by the sister
board of Louisiana Economic Development
Corporation and our LED team. So we have currently have 14 participating lenders that are working on our programs of micro-lending, and we have two -- I'm sorry, we have four additional institutions that are being vetted right now and could potentially become preferred lenders.

And those of you on this board, and especially for your constituents and your small businesses, this is a great program, and a great opportunity for them to have micro-loan lending, collateral support lending. We also have the
Small Business Loan Guarantee that we have, as well as we have our Venture Capital and C
Capital funding. And the State is posed to receive at least potentially up to $\$ 113$ million for this program over the next seven years.

We continue to have outreach
workshops. The next workshop is going to be in Monroe and it's going to be hosted by Origin Bank on July 20th. And then on July 26 in Thibodaux hosted by Select, we are going to have outreach programs there as well.

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
